- How Warren's work (or others') reflects the "scrutiny of our own experience of our own world"
- Warren as commentator on civic responsibilities
- Warren's textbooks and their influence on public discourse
- Warren's perception of democratic and non-democratic societies in literature

We invite abstracts for papers, panels, or roundtables addressing any aspect of Robert Penn Warren's work. For panel proposals, please include panel title, name and affiliation of each presenter, and individual abstracts of 50 – 100 words with paper title. For individual paper proposals, please send paper title and abstract of 50-100 words. For roundtables, please send an abstract of 50-100 words and a brief bio of each speaker.

Graduate students are welcome to propose individual papers (15 minutes in length) or panels of 3-4 speakers. If your abstract is accepted, and you wish to be considered for the Eleanor Clark Award, which carries a stipend of \$100, please send your completed paper to rpwcircle@gmail.com by April 1, 2020.
